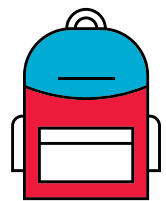

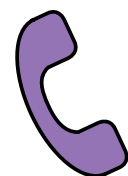

FISH begins full-fledged service to Islanders

FISH, Friends in Service Here, is charting a path on the Islands as an organization dedicated to helping people.
In its first week of full fledged operation, FISH volunteers, ready to help 24 hours a day, provided such services as transportation for a caller's weekly therapy session at Shell Point Village and aid in solving a simple household crisis (a rodent problem).
"We have had a great variety of calls," said FISH president Marilyn Bradley, who stressed that FISH is prepared to respond to the needs of the community.
Some of the services the more than 40 volunteers provide include companionship and help for the sick or disabled; aid in household tasks; and transportation for shopping excursions. FISH volunteers lend an ear or a hand to those in need. The service is strictly confidential, Bradley stressed.
"We can do lots of things. The organization is really in good shape. We are more than happy to give help at no cost whatsoever," she said.
Bradley said the organization also helps to relieve the police of calls that may not merit police at the scene, but do, nevertheless, require response.
Since its organization 10 weeks ago, more than 40 people of walks of life have been helped. A five-week trial first general meeting was held last week, the FISH volunteers are calling a work day.

LEADING THE WAY WITH *vaccination clinics* TO GIVE US ALL A BETTER SHOT AGAINST COVID-19



FISH knows the needs of our island neighbors. *One of this year's greatest needs was the opportunity to receive COVID-19 vaccines close to home.* In a year when most thought it impossible, FISH worked hard with local elected officials to secure several 'pop-up' vaccination sites, with the Department of Health administering vaccines for our neighbors.

As the pandemic continues and we respond to ever-changing circumstances and variants, we will continue working with amazing partners such as the Rotary Club of Sanibel-Captiva, the City of Sanibel Police Department, Sanibel Fire Department, Parish Nurses, Medical Offices, Pharmacies, City of Sanibel Officials, The Community House and our dedicated FISH volunteers.

Together, we will ensure that anyone living or working on Sanibel and Captiva islands that wants the COVID-19 vaccination has the opportunity to do so in their own backyard.

food programs

TO FEED THE NEED



Not knowing where your next meal is coming from is an experience that is scary and asking for help is humbling. Food insecurity is often one of the first reasons someone comes to FISH and is almost always a symptom of larger issues facing a household. Whether it's a young family struggling to keep kids' bellies full or a senior who is unable to cook nutritious meals as often as they once did, FISH is here to help. Each year, FISH distributes hundreds of thousands of pounds of food through the pantry, delivers thousands of hot meals to housebound island residents, and provides holiday meals to hundreds of families. *Feeding, nourishing, and helping neighbors in need—it's what we do.*

FOOD PANTRY

In 2021, **FISH distributed 255,980 pounds of food, equating to 213,316 meals.** A global pandemic, supply chain issues, and inflation has exacerbated an already significant issue facing many families in Lee County—food insecurity. Working families and island seniors struggling to decide if they'll pay rent or put food on the table, come to FISH for assistance with supplemental groceries, making it *FISH's most-used program with nearly 6,000 visits last year.*

MEALS-BY-FISH

Delivering hot meals to island seniors, through our partnership with Bailey's General Store, is *a program that has seen some of the greatest growth since the beginning of the pandemic.* In 2021 **FISH volunteers delivered 5,090 meals,** ensuring nutritious food was a daily reality for our neighbors who are housebound or have limited mobility.

HOLIDAY FOOD BASKETS

Keeping the holidays light and bright for everyone is at the heart of the FISH holiday food basket program. Each year, the community comes together to raise money, donate food, and assemble baskets of food with all the trimmings for Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. **In 2021, FISH distributed a record 562 baskets.**

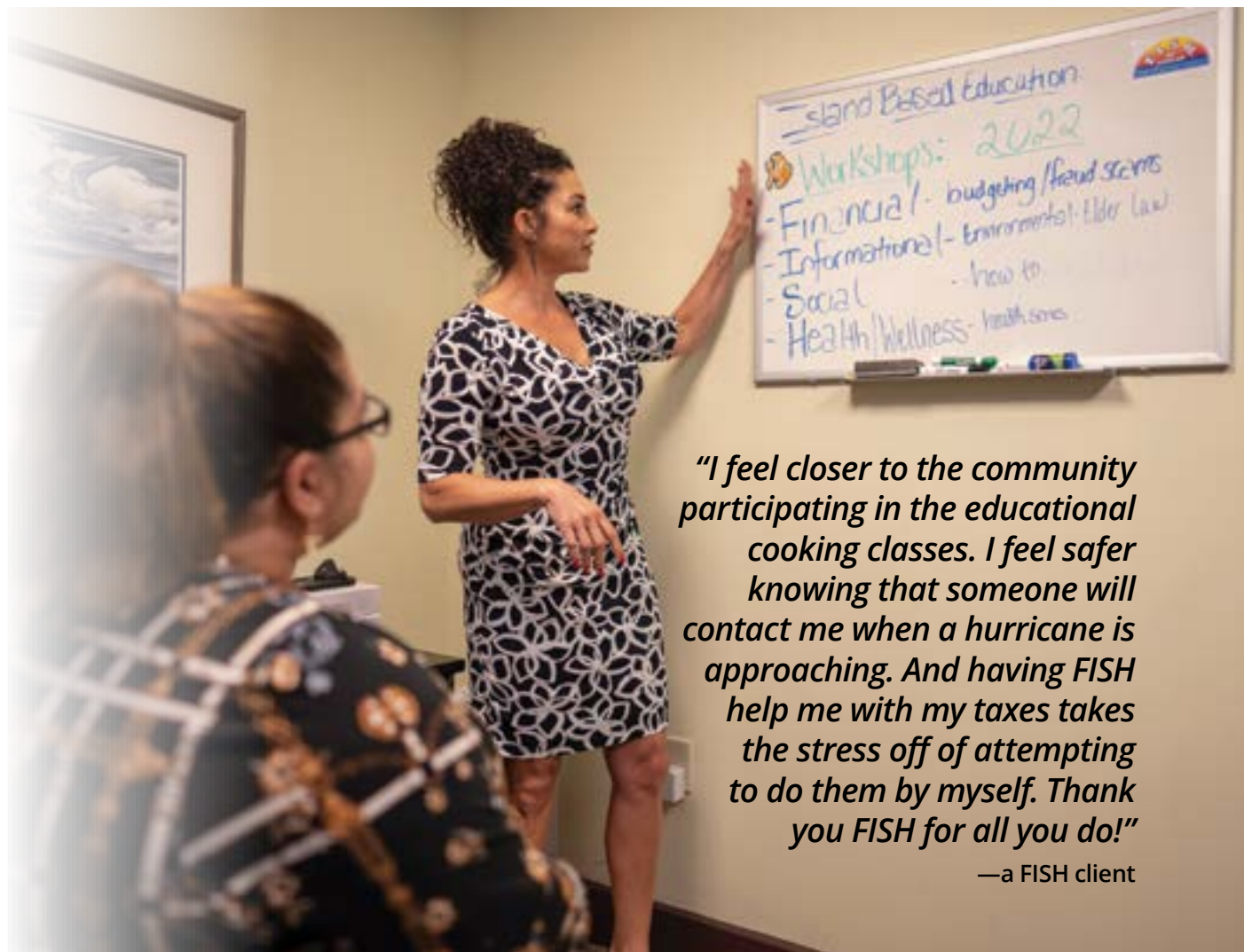


LEADING THE WAY WITH *empowerment* THROUGH ISLAND BASED EDUCATION

Enriching the lives of our neighbors through the gift of education is an important way FISH serves our community.

Education is an important way to empower our islands *to connect with each other*, in-person or virtually, to learn about and discuss topical issues.

We work to provide quality *educational opportunities for people of all ages*, from children to seniors and everyone in between.



SCHOLARSHIPS

FISH stands behind those living and working on our islands in their pursuit to *use education as a bridge to a better future*. Our scholarship program provides financial assistance for those seeking to further their careers with continuing education or to gain the credentials needed to make changes in their professional future.

WORKSHOPS

Our community workshops educate islanders on important topics facing them such as fall prevention, memory impairment, and aging in place as well as interactive programs such as our Cooking with Leslie virtual cooking classes. *FISH is proud to partner with other nonprofits and experts in their field to offer our monthly workshops.*

LEADING THE WAY WITH *connectedness* THROUGH SOCIAL & SENIOR SERVICES

Providing necessary supports for senior neighbors living on Sanibel and Captiva—to help them age in place with the independence they want and dignity they deserve—is at the forefront of FISH's Social & Senior Services programs. In 2021, FISH made *strategic investments* in improving the services offered for aging islanders. Here are some *highlights from just a portion* of our senior program offerings.



SENIOR NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Funded by the **Charitable Foundation of the Islands (CFI)**, FISH spearheaded an *island-wide, national benchmark survey* to not only receive feedback from those 55+ living on the islands, but to see how Sanibel and Captiva compare to other communities in senior welfare. **Results are an important piece of our continued work with the aging population.**

Some key points included 40% of respondents are in a caregiving role for a loved one and 20% of respondents did not have enough money for daily expenses. The most cited experiences with mental health issues included dealing with the loss of a close family member or friend (32%), feeling bored (28%) and feeling lonely or isolated (27%). However, only 1 in 4 felt mental health resources were adequate on the islands. **We are determined to help change that.**



TECHNOLOGY & CONNECTEDNESS PROJECT

With **funding provided by the AngeliFISH society**, FISH worked with seniors identified through existing program participation and referrals *to fill technology gaps for seniors on Sanibel and Captiva*. FISH worked one-on-one with seniors to evaluate how technology could improve their connectedness to friends, loved ones, the community, and the world. **Last year, nearly 20 island seniors received a tablet or other device, assistance with internet connection in their home, and IT service to learn how to use their new technology.**

SMILE BOXES

FISH was excited to continue delivering our popular **Smile Boxes** to islanders throughout the year. Developed in 2020 to address the social isolation perpetuated by COVID-19, **the program curates themed boxes each month with enriching, thoughtful, and sometimes yummy items for recipients.** Examples include the October Farmer's Market box which was assembled in partnership with the Sanibel Farmer's Market and included various edible items such as seasonal produce, jams, honey, fresh baked bread, and other treats such as handmade soaps. **Volunteers packed and delivered 576 smile boxes in 2021.**

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

FISH cares about the safety of all our island neighbors. Each year, prior to Hurricane Season, **FISH compiles a packet of all up-to-date information on evacuation, safety, precautionary measures, shelter locations, Sanibel re-entry passes, special needs shelters, and more.** These packets are provided free of charge to any islanders—in **2021, FISH distributed 522 packets.** Additionally, for our most vulnerable residents, FISH works with those who need a little extra help preparing ahead of hurricane season; ensuring their emergency evacuation plan is up to date, that an emergency contact is provided, and that we can remain *in touch with them before, during, and after a storm* through our volunteer Hurricane Committee.



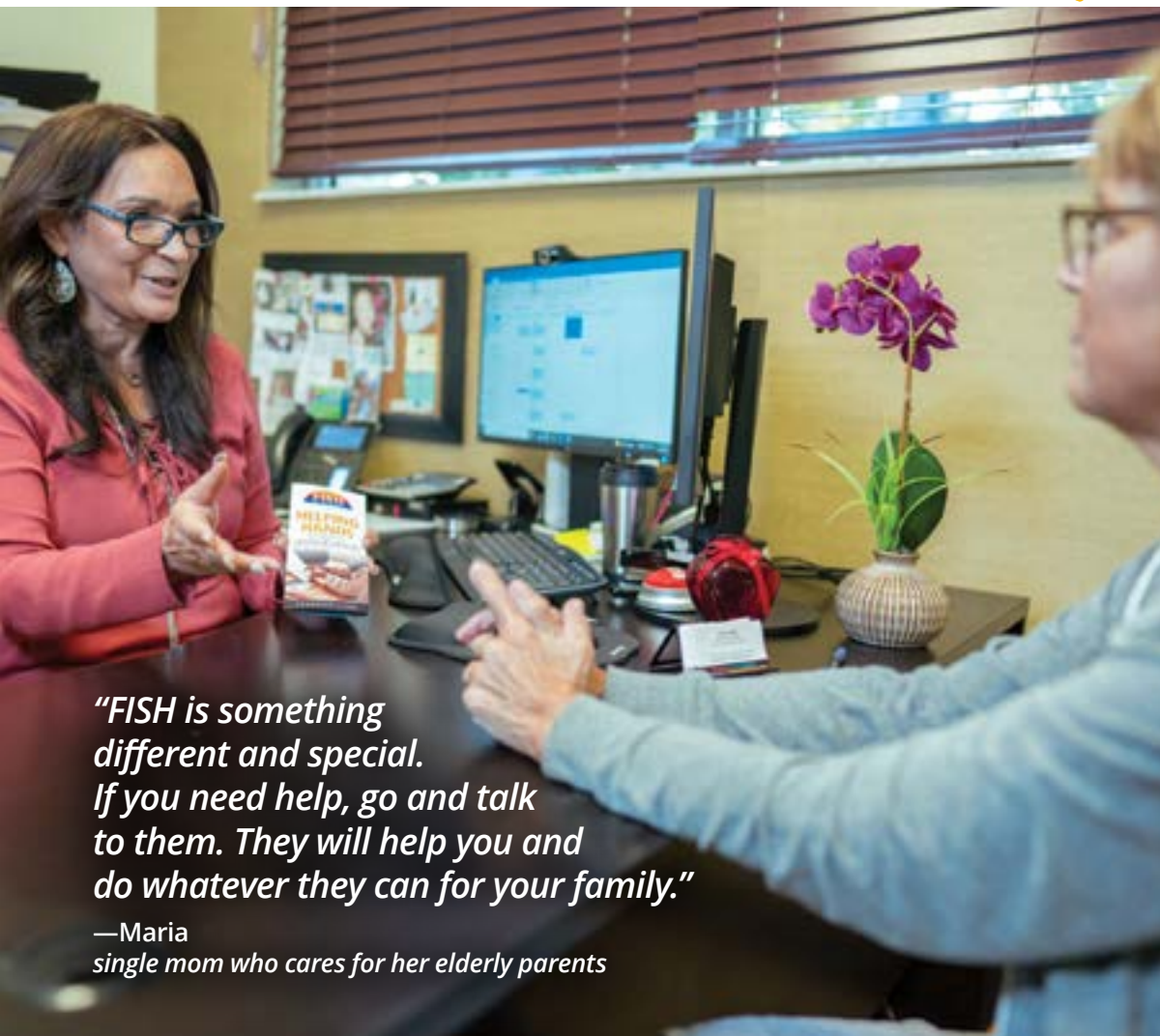

Facing unthinkable decisions such as putting food on the table or paying rent; paying a medical bill or keeping the lights on—these are questions that many working families ask themselves before they come to FISH. We are committed to working with families to create the supports they need with an individualized plan through our wrap-around services.

In 2021, FISH assisted with **847 instances of emergency financial assistance** for rent, utilities, healthcare, and other necessary expenses.

Providing a safety net to families dealing with short-term financial crises, which is often part of larger issues in the home, gives our clients a moment to breathe while they work with our professional staff to develop a long-term plan.

FISH is honored to be part of our neighbors' journey—removing obstacles and creating opportunities for families to thrive.

SUPPORTING *working families* & YOUTH



FOOD BACKPACK PROGRAM

In addition to our Food Pantry program, *our Backpack Program provides weekly nutritious, kid-friendly foods for children of families living or working on Sanibel and Captiva.* Each backpack has snacks, cereals, easy-to-heat pastas & proteins, milk, juice, and fresh fruit so during weekends, school breaks, and throughout the week children have access to nourishing foods. *To provide further healthful food and opportunities for quality family-time, FISH added a 'fresh meal' component in 2021.* Each week FISH curates a simple, healthy recipe, and gathers all the necessary fresh ingredients, so families can prepare a meal together at least once a week. This also provides learning opportunities for kids working alongside family in the kitchen. **We proudly distributed 4,294 food backpacks in 2021.**

YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP & SCHOOL SUPPLIES

FISH offers scholarship opportunities for youth for a variety of academically and developmentally enriching activities. *From weekly one-on-one tutoring to summer camp, from school field trips to sports uniforms, we work with families to ensure access to resources for children to thrive.* Additionally, each year, FISH provides children with *school supplies, basic clothing items and shoes, backpacks, and undergarments through our Back-to-School drive.* **In 2021, FISH helped 295 children with their back-to-school needs.**

ADOPT-A-FAMILY

The holidays can be a stressful time for families, especially those who are getting by on a limited income. FISH works hard, with our community, to make the holidays special for all our island neighbors. *Our Adopt-a-Family and toy drive program puts special emphasis on making the holiday season bright for kids by providing their parents with toys and clothes picked out based on their child's interests.* **Last year, 243 kids saw a happier holiday through this program.**

FISH is committed to working families and an important part of that work is the services to support our youth. From battling childhood hunger to providing resources for enriching educational experiences, we are here for our littlest neighbors.

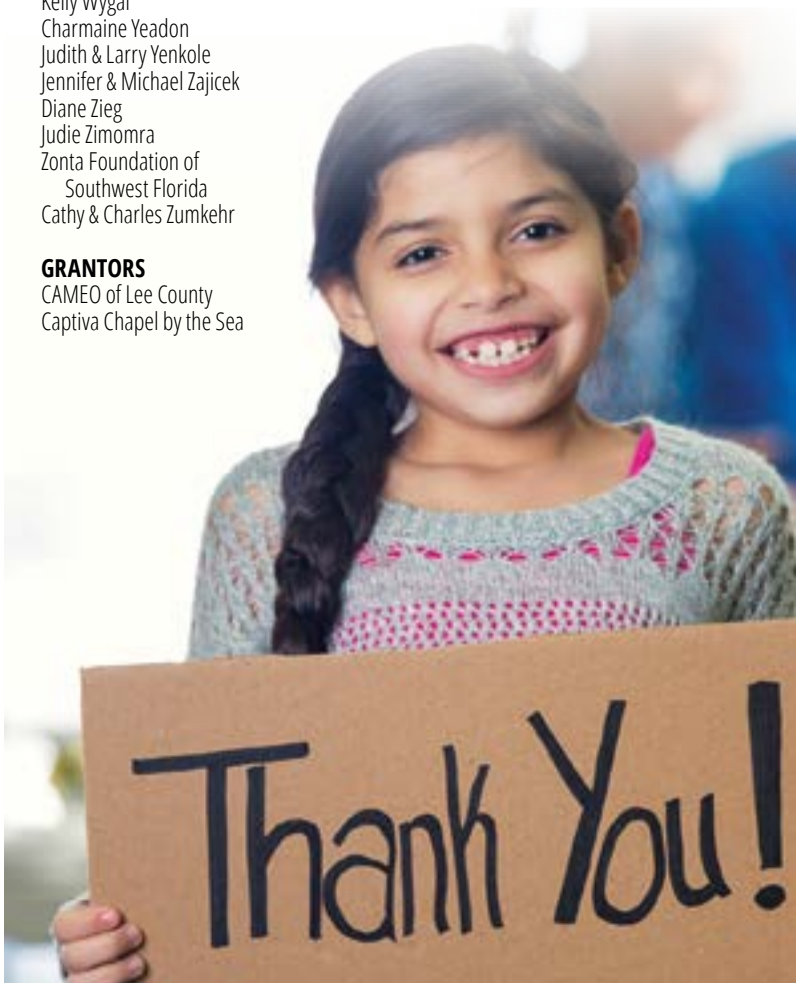

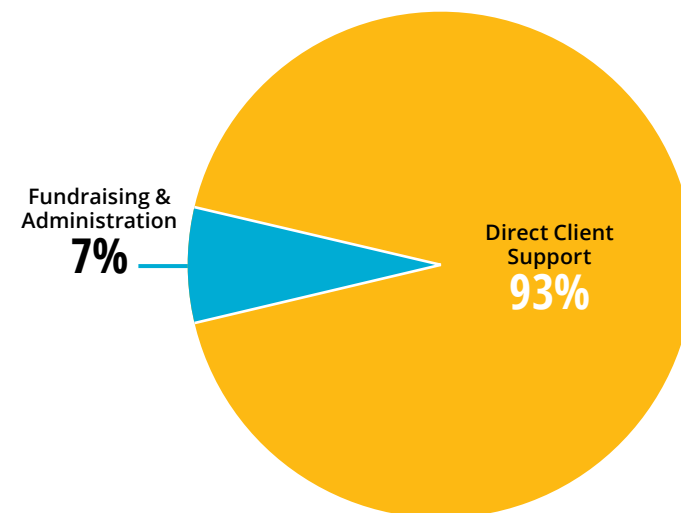
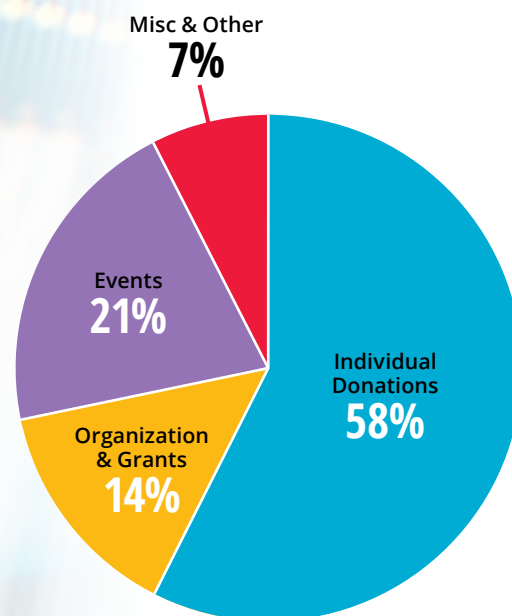

WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING?

"Planned giving" is simply a commitment, either revocable or irrevocable, to give to a Section 501(c)(3) charity, such as FISH or its Foundation, as part of a donor's overall financial or estate planning (as contrasted with typical annual donations).

TYPES OF PLANNED GIFTS

BEQUESTS—donations at death (through a Will or Trust) of cash, real estate, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, or other intangible assets

RETIREMENT PLANS—designation of FISH as a beneficiary of a retirement account, such as an IRA, 401(k), 403(b), pension or profit sharing plan

LIFE INSURANCE—designation of FISH as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy (whole life or term)

RETAINED LIFE ESTATE—transfer of real estate, such as a residence or commercial property, to FISH, but with the donor retaining the use of the property for the remainder of the donor's lifetime (e.g., the Woodring property)
