FISH Positions Team on Island for Hurricane Idalia



Exactly eleven months after Hurricane Ian made landfall, our team was positioned on Sanibel to aid with hurricane preparedness ahead of Hurricane Idalia.

Said Manuela Martinez, Disaster Administrative Director. "FISH is here to assist our community with supplies, food and information. We want everyone to be prepared and to stay safe. Our Food Pantry site on Sanibel will be our hub and we expect many neighbors to either visit or call with questions. Together, we will get through this."

The Food Pantry remained open from 9:00 a.m – 12:00 p.m. with no limitations on food and limits on water, toilet paper and paper towels. Working with our pantry partner, Midwest Food Bank, we were able to obtain 14 pallets of water delivered to our Sanibel location. "Midwest was

extremely accommodating and eager to get help to our community," continues Martinez. "We are so grateful for our partnership and for their team who went above and beyond to assist."

Annually, we update and provide a Hurricane Preparedness Resource packet with detailed information on where to go, what to do, and how to prepare in the event of an approaching storm. "The packet provides critical information and helpful steps to stay safe before, during and after a storm," says Erika Broyles, Senior Services Director of FISH, who oversees the program and coordinates the efforts of the team to insure all



information is correct. "Our volunteer committee made calls to islanders informing them of the situation and projected impact of Idalia," continues Broyles. "As we learned with Ian, it is very important to have up-to-date contact information for family and friends in both electronic and paper form so we can connect with non-local contacts on behalf of our islanders, if needed."

FISH stresses the importance of listening to authorities if an evacuation order is issued. "Experts know that the best way to stay safe is to follow evacuation orders and get out of the path of the storm," says Broyles. Hurricane Resource packets can be downloaded from our <u>website</u>.

Partnerships Aid Hurricane Survivors

Partnering with the United Way Gifts-in-Kind Program, we continue to distribute furniture and rebuilding supplies through our Point of Distribution Program (POD). The program is available to Sanibel and Captiva Island residents and workforce. Tom and Sue Bridges, island residents for nearly 50 years, have used the POD program. Says Sue," My husband and I would like to thank all of you, especially since nasty Ian took all our appliances and a lot of our furniture, destroying it beyond repair." The names of the individuals have been changed for privacy.



"Your Friday "give-away" days have really blessed us! We now have sturdy chairs upon which we can sit to take breaks. We also now have a dishwasher again and a sink inside the house as well," continues Sue. The Bridges have visited FISH distribution days on a few occasions as they continue to put their house back together. "Thanks to FISH, I once again have a lovely stand to display some of my decorations that miraculously survived surge waters. Seeing that beautiful stand makes me smile every day!"



"We especially want to thank you for connecting us with the person who had some extra drywall - whole sheets as well as cut off pieces," notes Sue. "FISH organized the pick-up date and time along with some really strong, young volunteers to help with the loading and unloading. Everything went very smoothly and efficiently - and my husband didn't have to lift a thing! The drywall materials will be a big help in restoring our bedroom and in stretching our budget. My husband

already made quick use of a cut-off piece that was exactly the

size he needed to fill in that last ceiling spot of smaller room. He is doubly grateful for that!"

In addition to the POD furnishings and drywall, the Bridges have used the food pantry to help supplement their grocery needs. "My husband stopped by the food pantry a few times and discovered new foods he now just has to have - the bag of potato soup mix his absolute favorite!"







Aiding Hurricane Survivors, cont'd

Furnishings, generously donated through the United Way Gifts-in-Kind program, along with doors, windows, cabinetry, linens, microwaves and more are available to those in need on the islands. Recipients must either be residents of Sanibel or Captiva or show proof of island employment. Distribution days take place twice monthly on Fridays from 9:00a-11:00a at the FISH building located at 2430 Periwinkle Way. Please bring a vehicle large enough to fit desired item(s), and some extra hands to lift items. The dates for distribution in Sept. are the 15th and the 29th.



"We are pleased to partner with United Way to offer this valuable program to our community members," says Manuela Martinez, Disaster Administrative Director. "So many residents and members of our workforce have benefited from this program and are thankful for the assistance."

Since landfall, we have been assisting islanders and the workforce with disaster recovery. Now the agency is working toward reducing the burden and hardship caused by Hurricane Ian by ensuring support is available. FISH has coordinated resources with local and state organizations, and is providing assistance with emergency supply distribution, financial assistance, case management, and distribution of rebuild supplies.

In addition to Long Term Recovery Services, we continue with our programs representing their four major pillars – Food, Island Based Education, Social and Senior Services, and Helping Hands. We continue to roll out and expand our traditional programs while simultaneously offering Long Term Recovery Services to community members, many of which have never had to ask for assistance before.





FISH & Partners Address Post-Storm Mental Health

According to Lee Health, "mental health issues after a catastrophic event like Hurricane Ian don't always appear right away. They can affect people for years. Studies show that survivors of lifechanging natural disasters face increased risk of developing anxiety, depression and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)".

FISH, along with SalusCare and Project H.O.P.E., have partnered to bring mental health resources to Sanibel and Captiva Islands.

"We realize many storm survivors are struggling with emotional stress, trauma and anxiety since Ian, and formed important partnerships to address these issues," says Maria Espinoza, Executive Director, FISH. "When Hurricane Idalia recently threatened our area, it became abundantly clear how necessary mental health resources are as they relate to hurricane survivors."

free 24/7 crisis counseling helpline for people involved in disasters, including hurricanes and tropical storms.





Runner Looking Forward to 240th Race!



Mr. Tom Kelly, a long-time race participant, recently registered for the FISH 10K/5K fundraising race, making this year's race his 240th entry since he began competing in 2012. "The hurricane threw me a little off track," says Tom. "I, along with 500 other ground floor condo owners in Fort Myers, had to leave for 4 months following the storm because of all the inside damage. I am thinking about moving to be closer to my children and grandchildren but I should still be here on December 2nd for the race." Tom notes that the race has always had a very special place in his heart.

We celebrated Tom and his accomplishments over the years, and helped him celebrate his 100th race back in 2018. Last year was to be in celebration of Tom's 80th birthday, but unfortunately the 2022 race was canceled due to Ian. "We are so happy Tom is returning for this year's race," says Diane Cortese, Race Committee Co-Chair. "It's been an absolute pleasure to follow his progress over the years and connect with his infectious energy."

Says Tom, "I'm looking forward to a fun morning and getting back on the island with all the other runners and good folks," continues Tom. "I've been receiving the FISH newsletter and what you, your staff, and your volunteers have accomplished is beyond

describing in words. What a blessing FISH has been to so many people in desperate need of help."

Tom began training and racing after the loss of his 50-year partner Barbara. For the last several years, Tom began powerwalking all of his races 'to save his knees for tennis'. Says Tom, "I have been proudly participating in the FISH 10K since 2012, and look forward to this year in support of FISH and their hurricane recovery efforts in particular."

The 15th annual road race is scheduled for Sat., Dec. 2, 2023 beginning at 7:30 a.m. The race is offered as an in-person event, with an option to participate virtually. Held as a major fundraising event for FISH, sponsorships and participant fees support the organization's mission of enriching the lives of all people in Sanibel and Captiva Islands as neighbors helping neighbors with social services, education and assistance.

This year we added a 5K to race day activities, followed by a kids' run and family day hosted by and in partnership with the Sanibel Recreation Center. Runner registration is currently open on the <u>RunSignUp platform</u>.

This year's race marks the first in-person event in recent years. In 2020-2021 the organization offered a virtual only race due to COVID and canceled the 2022 event due to Hurricane Ian.

Since Hurricane Ian, our relationship with FISH has been "complicated". We've not only remained volunteers but now

we're also clients who need the help FISH provides. The first day the causeway opened, October 19th, we continued to work on our battered house: demucked, cleaned, and moved ruined possessions to the curb. But a true highlight of our day and a lasting memory of normalcy and hope was when we saw our FISH staff/friends/family (FISH truly blend into one) distributing food and water at a local church. Maria and Manuela's big smiles and hugs brought tears to all of our eyes.

This is really what FISH is all about - helping people succeed and making their lives brighter - anyway you can. Since October 19th, as clients, we've picked up water, cleaning and sanitizing items, snacks and more - that were essential in getting our home fixed and keeping us going. Every time we visited FISH, there were friendly faces greeting us, whether they be FISH staff, local volunteers or volunteers traveling great distances just to help Sanibel citizens. FISH helped organize Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners that we enjoyed with our neighbors . We shared stories, got advice and just enjoyed socializing.

FISH has developed some incredibly insightful post hurricane programs to help a new group of clients - those rebuilding or displaced from the hurricane. All of this has been done by the same staff while maintaining core services! FISH has provided bedding, furniture, dry wall, emergency and cleaning supplies, shop vacs, grills, help with housing, social services and much more. Helping neighbors succeed!!!

Now that we've moved back to our Sanibel home, we volunteer every Tuesday afternoon at the Food Pantry. These days the clients are different from pre Ian: they are people with no home, people rebuilding, and some of those who've returned to work and have a home but still need lots of help. Different people but all in need of help, a friendly greeting, a conversation or smile. We are proud that FISH has had the flexibility and vision to serve these new clients. And we're glad to help them succeed as volunteers. All of the volunteers and staff with FISH are truly a dream to work with. They all have the same desire to help their fellow islanders.
